## Garry Breitkreuz M.P. elected Shooting Sports Ambassador of 2005

Canadian Member of Parliament Garry Breitkreuz has finally received the accolades he was due. Joining the ranks of such luminaries as Wilbur Smith, Larry Wilson and Sir Jackie Stewart, Garry was elected "Shooting Sports Ambassador of 2005" by the World Forum on the Future of Sport Shooting Activities.

Breitkreuz attended the World Forum's Annual General Meeting in Nuremberg, Germany to receive his award. It was presented by Keith Tidswell, Vice-President of the Sporting Shooter Association of Australia who stated, "Garry has been an inspiration to the shooting community, not just in Canada, but around the world. Global gun control can be fought and people like Garry are heading the charge".
